Donations pour in for Tuscaloosa cemetery project

Organizers say nearly twice the anticipated amount of donations has flowed into construct a memorial garden in Tuscaloosa at one of Bryce Hospital's three cemeteries.

More than \$150,000 in private and corporate donations has been raised for the project.

Organizers say the plan is for the memorial garden to be constructed by fall, in conjunction with the 150th anniversary of Bryce Hospital.

Dr. Tom Hobbs, executive director of Western Mental Health Center in Birmingham, says the memorial garden is planned for what is believed to be the site of infant burials.
