



Boeing grant funds expansion of Mental Health Center youth program into more Madison County schools

HUNTSVILLE, Alabama – Two more schools in Madison County will benefit from a school-based mental health program thanks to a \$33,000 grant from the Boeing Company’s Employee Community Fund.

Because of the grant, the Nova Center for Youth and Family – the child and adolescent division of the Mental Health Center of Madison County – will be able to expand its School Based Mental Health Program into two previously unserved schools this year, to potentially reach 50 additional students who demonstrate a social or emotional need. The Nova Center already serves students in 20 schools in Madison County.
